At the time of writing, Hospice Vaughan will have just marked two years since the opening of the Mario and Nick Cortellucci Centre of Excellence for Hospice Palliative Care. In this time, we have expanded from 10 to 12 beds and have had the privilege of caring for over 275 individuals and their families. The nature of our work of course brings much grief and sadness but because we support people to live fully until they die, we also bear witness to a tremendous amount of joy, faith, and beauty. This past year within the walls of our residence we have celebrated anniversaries, birthdays and even our first wedding.


Though our residence may be new we continue to build on our nearly thirty-year legacy of supporting our community with the very best in hospice palliative care through our community programs and services. This past year Hospice Vaughan supported over 600 individuals and their loved ones in their homes and in the community. These programs are a lifeline to those with life-limiting illness by providing them with assistance navigating the health care system, offering one-on- one counselling and group support, participation in our weekly Day Program and complementary therapies and wellness activities such as meditation and yoga.

And finally, it was with our legacy in mind that we reached out to donors and alumni, staff, volunteers, and community partners this past September to gather feedback to inform our new three-year strategic plan. This plan, an overview of which can be found in these pages, builds on our legacy and positions Hospice Vaughan to become a leader in hospice palliative care and to live up to our promise as a centre of excellence.

### **Our Residence**

In December of 2022 we expanded the Hospice Residence from 10 to 12 residential beds to respond to the growing need in the community. Our incredible staff provide 24 hour compassionate and comprehensive end-of-life care to support individuals and enable their loved ones to focus on what matters most.

#### 2022-23 Highlights:

- 210 individuals and their loved ones welcomed from 18 neighbouring Vaughan communities
- 260 batches of homemade soup made by Patrizia, our in-house food and hospitality coordinator
- Countless moments of joy and celebration, laughter and tears

## Community Programs & Services


Our hospice palliative care programs help those facing life-limiting illness to live fully, while supporting their loved ones. Our palliative approach is focused holistically on physical, psychological, social and spiritual care to improve quality of life whether that is weeks, months or years. Hospice palliative care is about ensuring the best quality of life for however long life remains.

Our programs and services are provided to people of all ages, free of charge and include: Palliative Support and In-home Hospice, Grief & Bereavement Supports, Caregiver Support, Child and Youth Support.

#### 2022-23 Highlights:

- 340 Individual Grief Support Sessions
- 306 referals made to other health services and suports by our Community Navigators
- 185 in-home palliative care clients served across Vaughan and surrounding communities

## The Impact of Philanthropy

With only 40% of our annual operating revenue coming from government sources, Hospice Vaughan relies on the generosity of our community to ensure that we are able to deliver the very best in hospice palliative care.

Each year we invite our community to help raise funds and drive awareness through 3 Signature Events; a Tribute Giving Program, Major Gifts, Foundation Grants, Corporate Donations and Community Hosted Events.

#### 2022-23 Highlights:

- Over \$375,000 net raised through our Gala, Hike and Golf events including over 1500 people in attendance.
- \$200,000 in Tribute Gifts donations made in honor of individuals who have died in our residence or in the community.
- \$35,000 raised through Community Events like the Butterfly Kisses Memorial, Halloween Spooktacular and the Holiday Baskets sale.







## SUMMARY OF REVENUE & EXPENSES

Revenue: \$ 2,584,928




Expenses: \$3,284,007
